

PICTURE FRAMES FOR EUROPEAN HISTORY

We will discuss *many* names, dates, places, events, and ideas throughout the more than 550 years that this course covers. Consequently, remembering all of them could be overwhelming if done at the last minute or during review before the final exam in May. In order to make studying more organized, throughout the year you will complete biographical picture frames and keep them in a binder. The completed frames will be collected at various points throughout the school year for a grade. **YOU MUST HAVE A BINDER DEDICATED TO THIS ASSIGNMENT.**

Directions: Based on the picture frame template included in this packet, you will need to compile the essential information (as well as some anecdotes to help you remember these men and women) using your textbook, class notes, and *your own research* for each person on the list. Each part of the frame should fulfill the following requirements:

A. Center Photo Box

For the photo box you will need to find a picture of the person (it is better to use an actual picture or painting rather than a caricature or political cartoon) and affix that photo in the box. Below the photo you will need to write in their name and title if appropriate (King, Queen, Pope, Prime Minister, etc.), birth and death dates, the country they are associated with, and a brief job description that goes beyond their title.

Note: You may not draw the person.

B. Economic Impacts

The left side of the box is reserved for the economic impacts of these people and their lasting legacy for their country, as well as for European History. While not all of the persons on the list will have made an economic policy, you should look for how their decision making could or did influence social or political developments (i.e. taxation, colonialism, imperialism, military funding, etc.)

C Political Policies and Impacts

The top box is reserved for the domestic and international political policies and actions taken. International policies and actions will include wars, treaties, alliances, major conferences, etc. Domestic policies are those occurring just within that person's own country or kingdom. Be sure to specify whether you are looking at domestic or international policies. Also, remember to provide impact analysis

D. Social Impacts

The right side of the box will be a section for social impacts. Categories for this part include, but are not limited to: education, women, technology, family, art, music, literature, etc.

- **At no time are your picture frames to be seen as a simple list of events. You should develop a sense of impact analysis so that you may find your information to be more purposeful when studying. ***

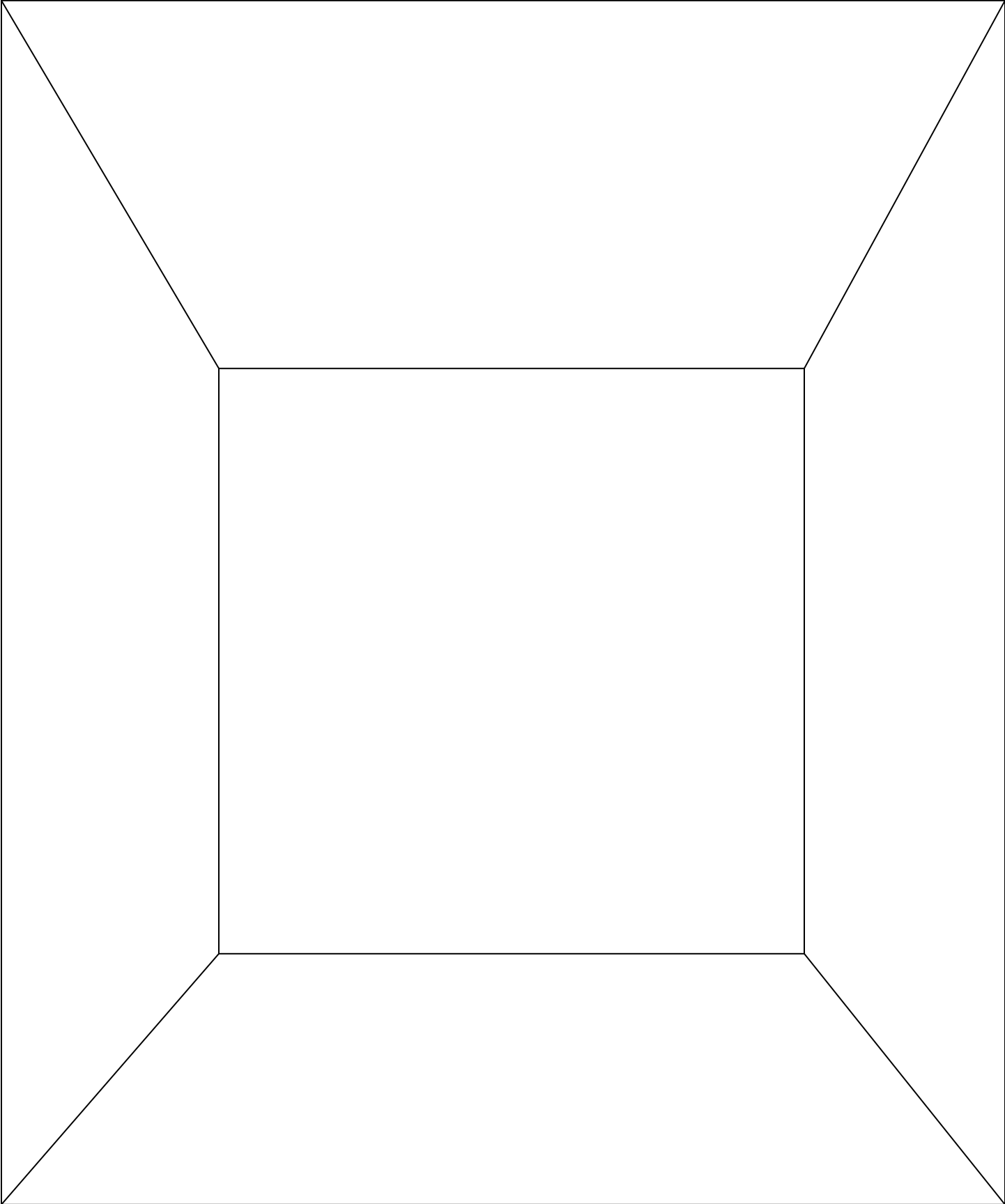
